

All fish must be weighed green, not gilled or gutted or mutilated FISH:

Fish that do not meet the standards set by the fishing committee will be disqualified

Only 3 fish per species may be weighed

All fish caught must be done in accordance with M.A.F rules and regulations

In the event of a tie, the first fish weighed in wins

DISPUTES: In the event of a dispute, the decision of the committee will be final CANCELLATION: The committee reserves the right to cancel or postpone this event

Children must be accompanied by and supervised by an adult at all times.

It is the skipper's responsibility to ensure that everyone is wearing a life jacket and that all boats are seaworthy and have the necessary safety equipment on board. It is highly recommended that all land based anglers and crew wear life jackets as well.
