The Life Education mobile classroom is to visit our school soon. Life Education is an-going health based education resource that aims to help give the young people of New Zealand, through

positive health-based education, the knowledge and skills to raise their awareness to live a fulfilling and healthy life.

Life Education provides a valuable resource for our school to use in the Health and Physical curriculum.

Life Education provides young people in their formative years with awareness and an understanding of their incredible body. They teach students how the body functions, and why the body is affected by substances that upset its delicate equilibrium.

Life Education uses positive, dynamic messages, conveyed non-judgementally, to encourage children to make informed decisions about what goes into their bodies. Students are also encouraged to recognise that everyone has a unique personality.


